

**SUMMARY OF ADA COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 745**

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ADA COUNTY CODE TITLE 2, CHAPTERS 2, 3 AND 4, IN THEIR ENTIRETY AND ENACTING NEW TITLE 2, CHAPTERS 2 AND 3 RELATING TO ADA COUNTY RECREATION AND EVENTS SERVICES AREAS, PUBLIC SAFETY COMPLEX, AND BENJAMIN CAMPUS, TO REORGANIZE PREVIOUS ORDINANCES AFTER CONSOLIDATION OF DEPARTMENTS, AND TO ADD, REMOVE AND REORGANIZE PROHIBITED ACTS AND USAGE RESTRICTIONS.

1. ORDINANCE REGULATES THE USE OF EMPLOYEE PARKING AT ADA COUNTY RECREATION AND EVENTS SERVICES AREAS, PUBLIC SAFETY COMPLEX AND BENJAMIN CAMPUS AS FOLLOWS:

It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle on, or own any vehicle found to be parked on, or to otherwise obstruct with such person's property, or own any property found to be obstructing any space reserved for the parking of the vehicles of the employees of the county of Ada, and which reserved parking space is located on real property owned by or leased to Ada County. Violation of this section shall constitute a misdemeanor. Also any vehicles so parked may be removed at the expense of the owner thereof. This chapter shall not be construed to apply to the person for whom the parking space is reserved, or to anyone who parks or owns any vehicle which is parked on any reserved parking space with the consent of the person for whom said parking space is reserved.

2. ORDINANCE REGULATES THE EXCRETION OF HUMAN WASTE AT ADA COUNTY RECREATION AND EVENTS SERVICES AREAS, PUBLIC SAFETY COMPLEX AND BENJAMIN CAMPUS, AND MAKES THE VIOLATION OF SUCH PROVISION A MISDEMEANOR, AS FOLLOWS:

To promote and protect the public health of the inhabitants of Ada County, it shall be a misdemeanor for any person to excrete human waste, except in designated restroom facilities, on any Ada County owned or leased property. For purposes of this subsection, the following definitions shall apply:

EXCRETION: The discharge of human waste from the body, including the acts of defecation and urination.

HUMAN WASTE: Human feces or human urine.

3. ORDINANCE REGULATES THE PARKING, DRIVING AND CAMPING ON ADA COUNTY RECREATION AND EVENTS SERVICES AREAS, PUBLIC SAFETY COMPLEX AND BENJAMIN CAMPUS, AND MAKES THE VIOLATION OF SUCH PROVISIONS AN INFRACTION, AS FOLLOWS:

A. Parking. It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle on, or own any vehicle found to be parked on or in any area in violation of posted parking restrictions. It shall also be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle, or to own any vehicle found to be parked on,

any area blocking an emergency exit, fire lane, or access point to a public parking area and/or public parking space.

- B. Prohibited Activities. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate go-carts, remote controlled airplanes, windsurfing boards, skateboards, or engage in in-line hockey, skating, or driver's training on the Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas parking lots.
- C. Motor Vehicle Code. The provisions of Title 49, Chapters 6, 7 and 8, Idaho Code, shall be applicable to motor vehicles in any area in any officially designated Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas.
- D. Speed Limit. The speed limit in all areas shall be ten (10) miles per hour unless specifically posted at a different speed.
- E. Motorized Vehicles: All motorized and off road vehicles must stay on authorized established roadways. No motorized vehicles shall be permitted on any sidewalk, bike path, trail or area designated for use by pedestrians, bicyclists, and other wheeled activities moved solely by human power. Law enforcement personnel, emergency service providers, Ada County employees in the course of their employment, others authorized by the director, and persons operating a wheelchair, electric wheelchair, other handicapped vehicles or an electric personal assistive mobility device are exempt from this regulation.
- F. Overnight Camping and Parking: Overnight camping and parking is prohibited in Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas except as permitted by the Board for special group activities, festivals or holiday events.

4. ORDINANCE REGULATES THE POSSESSION AND CONTROL OF ALCOHOL AT ADA COUNTY RECREATION AND EVENTS SERVICES AREA, AND MAKES THE VIOLATION OF SUCH A MISDEMEANOR, AS FOLLOWS:

All alcohol consumption is prohibited in or on parking lots, sidewalks, paths, restrooms and roads in Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas. No liquor, beer, or wine, as defined in Idaho Code §§ 63-902(8), 63-1001(a) and 63-1303(a), as may be amended from time to time, may be brought to or served at any portion of Expo Idaho (excluding Ladybird Park) without a contract with Ada County expressly allowing for such possession or service. Furthermore, no liquor, beer or wine, as defined in Idaho Code §§ 63-902(8), 63-1001(a) and 63-1303(a), as may be amended from time to time, may be brought to or served in any other portion of Ada County Recreation and Events Services Area which has been leased for a private function or event or to any function or event held by Ada County without the payment of an alcohol service fee to Ada County or a contract with Ada County expressly allowing for such possession or service. This subsection does not apply to the portions of Expo Idaho that are leased to Hawks Memorial Stadium and the area leased to the recreational vehicle park.

6. ORDINANCE REGULATES ACTS ON ADA COUNTY RECREATION AND EVENTS SERVICES AREAS AND MAKES THE VIOLATION OF SUCH AN INFRACTION AS FOLLOWS:

- A. Glass Containers: No glass beverage containers are permitted in Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas, except in the Barber Park Education and Event Center Building or attached shelters and the buildings at Expo Idaho, upon prior approval of the Director.
- B. Littering: All refuse or garbage must be placed in proper trash receptacles. Littering in Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas is prohibited.
- C. Control of Speed: Users of the Greenbelt and bike paths are expected to act responsibly and courteously and not to exceed a safe and prudent speed. It is prohibited for cyclists, scooter riders, and skaters to use the Greenbelt or bike paths at such a speed as to endanger or injure other users.
- D. Ski Poles and Push Poles: The use of ski poles, push poles, or other such similar equipment on the Greenbelt or bike paths is prohibited, except that such ski pole usage shall be permitted by cross-country skiers when sufficient snow is present such that pole usage will not cause damage to the Greenbelt or bike paths.
- E. Sound. No person shall operate or aid in the operation of private radios, stereophonic or sound-amplification devices at a greater operating level than sixty-two (62) decibels measured at a distance of twenty feet (20') from such radios or devices unless the Director gives permission. If during the same day the person is again found in violation of this paragraph, that person will be required to leave the Ada County Recreation and Events Services Areas.
