Wesley Allan Tuttle, 55, of Draper, Utah, will be in an Ada County courtroom today to be arraigned on a first degree murder charge for the death of Lisa Chambers. Chambers, 14, was killed on November 10, 1982. The criminal complaint filed against Tuttle alleges he murdered the teenager by strangling her with his hands.

Lisa's parents reported her "missing" when she didn't return home from school, the same day she was killed. Lisa's school books were found in a trash bin at the Flying J Truck Stop on Overland Road four days later.

On November 25, 1982, Thanksgiving Day, Lisa was found dead, by hunters, in a cornfield near the corner of Lake Hazel and Five Mile Roads.

Tuttle will be arraigned on the murder charge by the Honorable Darla Williamson today at 1:30 p.m. at the Ada County Courthouse.

Tuttle is being held in custody without bond awaiting the court appearance.

The Ada County Prosecutor's Office and the Ada County Sheriff's Office will hold a press conference immediately following today's arraignment in the first floor lobby of the courthouse.

Tuttle is presumed, by law, to be innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
